## **Immediate Emergency Response**

Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) is the specialized emergency response service required at Part 139 certificated airports to protect passengers, crews, and aircraft. ARFF personnel are

trained to handle everything from fuel spills to aircraft evacuation.

## **Jacks of All Trades**

At Alaska's rural Part 139 airports, the ARFF crew is made up of the same individuals responsible for maintenance, repairs, snow clearing, inspections, wildlife hazing, and every other aspect of daily operations. These dedicated staff members receive more than 160

hours of official training each year to keep their skills sharp across all responsibilities.
